



**Resolution Adopted by the
Subcommittee of Culture and Society
on December 20, 2019**

Universal Declaration of Kinship Rights

Whereas recognition of the inherent excellence and of the inalienable success of every kin is the foundation of leadership, perfection, and order in the world,

Whereas it is essential, through independent actions, to assist the United Nations in achieving statehood,

Whereas it is essential to promote the development of inter-familial cooperation with organized kins,

Whereas the Families of the Nobility International have in the Charter reaffirmed their faith in international law, the Charter of the United Nations, and human rights,

Whereas defamation and dehumanization of kinship have resulted in classless acts which have disgusted the conscience of humanity, and the advent of a historical era in which Families shall earn the privilege of inter-familial kinship,

Whereas Member Families have pledged themselves to promote, in co-operation with the Nobility International, universal respect for excellence, the desirability of perfection, and humanitarian leadership,

*Now, therefore the Subcommittee of Culture and Society,
Subject to the approval of the Supreme Committee,*

Proclaims this Universal Declaration of Kinship Rights as an elite standard of success for law-abiding nations, to the end that every Family involved in the government of a United Nations Member

state and any component of the United Nations system shall promote respect for these rights and by perfectionist measures, national and international, to secure their universal and effective recognition and observance,

Requests the Supreme Committee to approve this resolution's entry into force.

Article 1

All kinship groups are formed from collective leadership and excellence. They are endowed with homogeneity and loyalty and should act towards one another in a spirit of trust.

Article 2

Kinship groups who affirm faith in international law are entitled to all rights set forth in this Declaration. The only exception shall be made on the basis of a kinship group's support for or excusing of criminal states, terrorist networks, and sexually perverted regimes.

Article 3

All kinship groups have the right to exist, to preserve their culture, to explore their identity, to honour Familial and kinship history, and to pursue their collective interests.

Article 4

In the present Declaration, phylocide means a type of genocide, as defined in Article 2 of United Nations resolution 260 A (III), and further includes any of the following acts committed with intent to destroy, in whole or in part, a kinship group, as such:

- a. Causing serious physical, technological, economic, financial, defamatory, legal, or political harm to members of the group;
- b. Forcibly imposing the systematic emotional abuse of minors with real or fictional traumatic historical events attributed to the actions of their ancestors;
- c. Forcibly exposing minors to educational or entertainment media which encourages childlessness with the intention of jeopardizing the future existence of a kinship group;
- d. Forcibly exposing minors to educational or entertainment media which critiques their culture with the intention of encouraging mutiny, defection, treason, apathy, nihilism, or self-hatred among members of the group.

Article 5

All kinship groups and individual Families shall have the inalienable right to defend themselves and each other against phylocide; phylocide shall be prohibited in all its forms.

Article 6

All kinship groups have the right to recognition everywhere as an entity.

Article 7

No kinship group shall be subjected to arbitrary punishment.

Article 8

All kinship groups shall enjoy the presumption of innocence unless proven guilty.

Article 9

All kinship groups and individual Families shall have, within the limitations of applicable law, the right to develop technological, economic, financial, legal, political, anti-defamatory, and open-source intelligence systems and infrastructure, individually or in cooperation with one another, with law-abiding nations, and with the United Nations system.

Article 10

All kinship groups have the right of thought, except for the contemplation of committing acts of genocide or sexual perversion.

Article 11

All kinship groups have the right of expression, except for the promotion of genocide or sexual perversion.

Article 12

All kinship groups have a right to a noble world order of international law in which the rights set forth in this Declaration can be fully realized.

Article 13

The rights in this Declaration may in no case be exercised contrary to the purposes and principles of the Nobility International or the United Nations.

Article 14

Nothing in this Declaration may be interpreted as implying for any kinship group or constituent Family the right to engage in any activity aimed at the undermining the rights set forth herein.
