



**Resolution Adopted by the
Subcommittee of Culture and Society
on March 27, 2020**

Nobility International Code of Ethics

Whereas the Noble Families of the Nation of Aristopolis have expressed concern for the potential of misguided Perfectionists to act unethically in the name of Perfectionment,

Whereas these Noble Families have been compelled to take measures to minimize the potential for wrong-doing and to hold wrong-doers accountable,

The Subcommittee of Culture and Society,

Subject to the approval of the Supreme Committee,

Having considered the Nobilitas' Universal Demand of Ethical Enforcement of August 1, 2019, intended to enforce a code of ethics,

Acknowledges the reputational risk posed by unaccountable individuals to the Noble faith, the Aristophilian community, and the public perception of the Perfectionment intellectual movement,

Recognizes the protection and deterrent effect offered by holding wrong-doers accountable,

Reaffirms its commitment to defending humanity,

Declares the Nobility International Code of Ethics as an ethical standard for all Perfectionists, to offer recourse to the public and to preserve the credibility of the Nation of Aristopolis,

Requests the Supreme Committee to approve this resolution's entry into force.

Article 1

1.1 "Aristophile" shall mean a lover of excellence and ally of the Noble community – a righteous human.

1.2 “Perfectionist” shall mean a Noble or Aristophile, both of whom share the mission of the Perfectionment intellectual movement which is to correct all of the errors of the world.

1.3 “Professional Perfectionist” shall mean a Perfectionist who dedicates his or her time to the Perfectionment of humanity on a full-time basis.

1.4 “Registered Perfectionist” shall mean a Professional Perfectionist who is registered with the Board of Ethics.

1.5 “NICE” shall mean the Nobility International Code of Ethics.

Article 2

No Perfectionist shall cooperate, collaborate, assist, or in any way associate with anyone who deceptively uses the title of “Registered Perfectionist” or makes one believe that he or she is a Registered Perfectionist, unless the person is registered with the Board of Ethics.

Article 3

All Perfectionists shall be expected to abide by the NICE.

Article 4

Perfectionists shall respect and command respect, at all times.

Article 5

Perfectionists shall use generally recognized scientific and professional principles in the exercise of any Perfectionment activity.

Article 6

Perfectionists shall always take into account the consequences of their activities upon humanity.

Article 7

Perfectionists shall fulfill their professional obligations with competence, integrity, objectivity, and care.

Article 8

Perfectionists are prohibited from misrepresenting their competence, the effectiveness of their own activities, or those of Perfectionists, in general.

Article 9

Perfectionists shall take reasonable measures to ensure that any 3rd party involved in the Perfectionist's activities complies with the NICE.

Article 10

When Perfectionment activities are provided as a service, the Perfectionist takes into account the client's demands and expectations as well as the limits of the skills and means at the Perfectionist's disposal.

Article 11

Perfectionists are prohibited from providing Perfectionment services to minors and anyone who has not explicitly expressed consent.

Article 12

Perfectionists shall respect the privacy of people with whom they have a professional relationship, in particular by refraining from collecting information and exploring aspects of private life which have no connection with the professional services of the Perfectionist.

Article 13

Perfectionists shall disclose nothing about a client unless the client has explicitly consented to the disclosure, law enforcement has an appropriate warrant, or if disclosing the information to law enforcement would result in the saving of a life or the cessation of harm.

Article 14

Perfectionists are prohibited from placing their personal interests above that of their clients, or that of humanity.

Article 15

Perfectionists are prohibited from providing Perfectionment services if it would have the appearance of impropriety.

Article 16

Perfectionists shall, at all times, engage in exemplary behavior reflective of the class, ethics, and vision of Nobles and Aristophiles.
